Guidelines and Rubrics for Book – 20 Classwork Points Report:

Written Book Report

Underline book title. Include author. 2 **points**

- Follow all rules of grammar (capitalization, indentation, etc.) 5 points
- Start report with a catching beginning sentence (Not "My book report is about...")
 2 points
- Have a well-defined beginning, middle, and end (Organization) 5 points
- Tell complete story (Content) 4 points
- Report turned in on time **2 point**

Rubric – 20 points

Creative Presentation Some examples are: diorama, storyboard, poster, or pamphlet

- Include book title (underlined) and author
 - 2 points
- Be creative **3 points**
- Be able to answer questions on project (Relationship of project to book) **5 points**
- Summarize the book- beginning, middle, and end
 - 4 points
- Be able to explain project in your own words (Content) **4 points**
- Report turned in on time **2 point**
